
How to handle a Septic System Emergency

Inspect the Area (Safely)

Check the septic tank and drain field for visible issues like:

- Overflowing or leaking around the septic tank.
- Pooling water or soggy areas near the drain field.
- Gurgling sounds from your plumbing.



Stay Calm and Asses the situation

Are there any obvious blockages in toilets or drains?
Is the problem confined to one fixture, or is it affecting the entire home?
Is there a visible leak or pooling water outside?



Stop Using Water Immediately

Turn off all faucets, appliances, and avoid flushing toilets. The goal is to prevent overloading your septic system while you deal with the issue.

- Be Careful What You Flush: Only flush toilet paper and human waste. Avoid flushing nonbiodegradable items like wipes, paper towels, or feminine hygiene products.
